Notice for the 2024 Global Korea Scholarship GKS-U Scholars

Dear 2024 GKS Undergraduate Scholars!

Congratulations! We are happy to inform you that you have been selected as 2024 GKS Undergraduate Scholars. What follow below are important information you should know before you enter Korea.

Please read ALL information thoroughly and take necessary actions accordingly.

A. KOREAN LANGUAGE PROGRAM

Period: March 1, 2024 ~ February 28, 2025 (1 year)

From 2024, all newly selected GKS Scholars will take the Korean language program at the same university where they will conduct their degree program.

* Exception: UNIST will designate another university for a Korean language program.

Minimum language proficiency: TOPIK level 3

During a year-long mandatory Korean language program, scholars must achieve at least TOPIK level 3 to enroll in their degree program. If a scholar fails to reach TOPIK level 3 after one year of Korean language program, he or she will not be allowed to proceed with their degree program. In addition, certain university or department requires students to submit a valid TOPIK certificate of level 4 or higher. Scholars who applied to such department may not enter their degree program if they fail to achieve the required TOPIK certificate during a yearlong Korean language program.

Scholars who achieve TOPIK level 5 or 6 within the first 6 months of Korean language program must start their degree program in the following semester (September 2024). In this case, even though a scholar's language program period reduces to 6 months, the degree program period will remain the same.

Accommodation

GKS scholars are required to live on-campus in the dormitory in most cases with other roommates during their Korean language program. To live off-campus, scholars should obtain approval from the Korean language institution with a valid TOPIK level 3.

Scholarship does not cover dormitory fee, so scholars are responsible to pay for their accommodation. Most scholars pay for their accommodation within the stipend they receive each month. Please be noted that scholarship money including monthly stipend will be provided only after a scholar opens a bank account in Korea. One can open a bank account after an issuance of ID card (alien registration card). This procedure may take up to 1~3 months depending on the individual's circumstances. Therefore, it is recommended that scholars bring additional funds that could cover their initial stay in Korea for a month or two.

B. DEGREE PROGRAM

Scholarship period including one-year mandatory Korean language program

* Scholars who are exempt from the Korean language program will directly start their degree program in March 2024.

Degree	Scholarship Period	Note
Korean language Program	March 1, 2024 ~ February 28, 2025	1 year
Associate Degree	March 1, 2025 ~ February 28, 2027	2 years
Bachelor's Degree	March 1, 2025 ~ February 28, 2029	4 years

^{*} Scholars who were accepted to departments of different program duration (3, 5 or 6 years) will have a different scholarship period. Their scholarship period will be indicated on their invitation letter.

Accommodation

On-campus housing is generally available for degree program scholars who apply for one at their respective universities. Make sure to check the accommodation details with the universities.

Scholarship does not cover dormitory fee, so scholars are responsible to pay for their accommodation. Most scholars pay for their accommodation within the stipend they receive each month. Please be noted that scholarship money including monthly stipend will be provided only after a scholar opens a bank account in Korea. One can open a bank account after an issuance of ID card (alien registration card). This procedure may take up to 1~3 months depending on the individual's circumstances. Therefore, it is recommended that scholars bring additional funds that could cover their initial stay in Korea for a month or two.

C. INVITATION LETTER

We will send you an official NIIED invitation letter, with which you can apply for a student visa to enter Korea. The invitation letter will be sent to you individually via email in a pdf file. Hard copies will not be delivered to you. Please make sure to check your email inbox daily. If you do not receive the invitation letter by January 15th, 2024 (Korea Standard Time), please email us at kgspniied@korea.kr with your **GKS Scholar Number*** in a subject title. (e.g., [CS01241335]-invitation letter not received)

* Your GKS Scholar Number (also known as CS Number) is written before your name in the final successful candidates list. It is different from your previous Candidate Number that was used in the 2nd round successful candidates list. From now on, you will be using your GKS Scholar Number whenever you need to communicate with us.

D. VISA APPLICATION

Apply for a visa at the nearest Korean Embassy or Consulate in your country with the invitation letter. You would still need to apply for a visa even if your country has signed a visa agreement with the government of Korea. Please remember the type of visa you should apply for.

- O D-4 visa is for those who will start a Korean language program.

 (All scholars will be initially issued with a 6 months D-4 visa, and scholars are responsible to renew their visa during their Korean language program. NIIED does not support visa renewal fee.)
- O D-2 visa is for those who are exempt from the Korean language program and start their degree program.

The documents required for visa application may differ from each embassy, and it is strongly recommended that you contact the Korean embassy to check the required documents before you apply for a visa. You can also visit "the Korean Visa Portal" at www.visa.go.kr. In general, you would need the following documents:

- ✓ Visa Application Fee is generally exempt for GKS scholars.
- √ Valid Passport
- ✓ A Photo in a standard format
- ✓ VISA Application Form (available at the Korean Embassy/Consulate)
- ✓ An Invitation Letter issued by NIIED
- ✓ Document indicating the final level of education
- ✓ Standard Admission Letter issued by universities

NIIED sent an official letter to all Korean embassies around the world, asking for their cooperation in visa processing for this year's GKS scholars. However, each embassy may request for additional documents if it is deemed necessary for visa evaluation.

With the NIIED's invitation letter, you can apply for a visa without a proof of your financial ability to support yourself.

Visa application process may take an extended period of time depending on the scholar's personal or country circumstances, so scholars should obtain necessary documents and apply for a visa as soon as possible.

It is each scholar's responsibility to verify if the name of university is indicated correctly in the visa.

If, by any chance, you are issued a wrong type of visa or if any error is found, contact the Korean embassy or consulate immediately to make necessary correction. It is difficult to change the information in your visa once you enter Korea with the incorrect information.

<u>Please do not be negligent about the type of visa you were issued, and the personal information</u> printed in the visa.

(Attention!!) Scholars who are currently residing in Korea with D-2, D-4, or other visa type may need to return to their home country to obtain a new visa for GKS program. In this case, the round-trip airfare will not be given to scholars. Corresponding scholars must contact the Immigration Office that has jurisdiction over their university to find out if they can issue their visa without leaving the country.

* For example, scholars who are currently residing in Korea with a D-4 visa may have to get a new D-4 visa from their home country.

E. ENTRY AIR TICKET

1. Entry Period

Scholars must arrange their entry schedule with their university. All scholars should enter Korea before the semester begins on March 1, 2024, mostly between February 19 and February 29, 2024.

2. Purchase of Flight Ticket

- O NIIED will provide funds for a <u>one-way economy class flight ticket</u> which must be purchased through the university.
- O The itinerary must be a <u>direct flight</u> or a flight with the shortest route to Korea.
 - ※ If there is no direct flight available, the layover should be limited to 30 hours.
- O Each university will ask you to submit a flight entry information form. You must complete the form and **submit it back to the relevant institution**.
- O Your ticket must be arranged through the university. NIIED does not book tickets for scholars.
- O Those who have flight connections in another country are responsible to check the transit visa requirements in that country and prepare in advance. For example, if you need to transfer flight within the Schengen Area or in the United States, you must get a Schengen visa or a U.S. transit visa before your departure. All fees incurred in the process of getting the transit visa are not covered by NIIED.
- O NIIED does not cover the cost for domestic travels within a scholar's own country.
- O NIIED does not cover the cost of travel insurance. It is up to an individual to decide whether to purchase travel insurance or not.
 - X Scholarship will cover the medical insurance from the beginning of a semester in early March. Therefore, we recommend scholars to subscribe to a travel insurance until the end of February 2024.
- O NIIED does not cover baggage fees.
- O NIIED does not cover any additional fees incurred prior to your departure. (e.g., expense for a self-quarantine before departure, PCR test fee, etc.)
- O Any ticket change fee (change of schedule, cancelation of flight, etc.) is responsible to whom generated such situation.

3. Entry airfare will <u>not</u> be provided to the following GKS scholars:

- GKS scholars who have stayed in Korea at the time of final announcement.
- The round trip airfare will not be provided to GKS scholars selected in China and Czech Republic in accordance with the agreement made between Korean government and the governments of two countries

F. ARRIVAL

- O After arriving in Korea, scholars must contact the person in charge of GKS (GKS representatives) at the university immediately. All scholars must have the contact information of the representatives who are responsible for GKS students in the university before arriving in Korea. All scholars must follow the instructions and regulations given by the representatives at the universities.
- O All scholars are advised to travel with a valid Korean visa and the invitation letter issued by NIIFD

G. LEARN ABOUT KOREA BEFORE YOU COME TO KOREA

H. OTHER INFORMATION

O In case a GKS scholar decides to withdraw from their scholarship program before their entry to Korea or before their enrollment to the respective Korean language institution/university, he or she must contact the embassy (embassy track) or the university (university track) with a letter including the reason of withdrawing. The scholarship will be canceled only when NIIED receives an official letter from an embassy/university regarding the matter.

A scholar who withdraws from the scholarship program within the first three months must immediately refund the full amount of scholarship received during their stay. This includes airfare, settlement allowance, monthly allowance, Korean language training expenses, tuition, insurance, Korean proficiency grants, etc.

Scholars who withdraw from the GKS program after they are listed on the final successful candidates list will not be eligible to re-apply for the program in the future.

- Even after a candidate has been selected as a final successful candidate, if a scholar is found to be disqualified or an application document of a scholar is discovered to be a fraud, the scholarship will be canceled.
- O (Attention!!) GKS scholars are advised to bring the documents listed below (in original or in authenticated version.) for future purposes. (e.g., visa renewal, change of visa type, etc.) The list is not all inclusive, and scholars are encouraged to bring any documents that are considered important to them during their studies in Korea.
 - ✓ Graduation Certificate or Diploma (It is strongly recommended to have your certificates apostilled or consular-confirmed)
 - ✓ Academic Transcript
 - ✓ Proof of Citizenship (e.g., birth certificate, family registration, passport copy)
 - ✓ Printed copy of NIIED Invitation Letter
 - ✓ Medical Examination results (OPTIONAL: the form will be provided by the institution if it is required)
 - X You don't have to re-submit noted items directly to NIIED. However, they would be asked by the visa center or your school depending on your statement. If you have any further questions, please contact the respective institutions.
